X. NEW BUSINESS

2023/24-11-73/ Baraiya – ASI Dreamers, Social Justice, DA, USAF, Fall 2023 Scholarships

Moved and seconded. The scholarship timeline was reviewed in its entirety. The ASI Scholarships opened on September 22 and closed on October 20. The committee included the chair, one (1) ASI Board member, one (1) ASI student employee, and three (3) students at large. Each committee member used a rubric to score each essay. The top recipients by score will receive the scholarship if deemed eligible by Student Affairs. Adopted.

2023/24-11-74/ Boulos, Baraiya – Recommendation to the Board for ASI Memorial Scholarship Recipients Fall 2023 (Bayless, Lara, Lumachi, Tanton, Ramos)

Moved and seconded. The timeline was the same as the ASI scholarships. The Tanton Scholarship did receive a tie in scores which was broken by the ASI Director of Finance, Hoan Nguyen. The committee membership requires the chair, one (1) Board member, and two (2) students at large. Extra students were appointed however, due to availability and lack of responses the committee membership was not met as outlined in the Operating Rules. Adopted.

Gavel was passed to Vice Chair before discussion. Gavel passed back to Chair after vote.

2023/24-11-75/ Boulos, Jimenez, Ghani – Resolution Condemning Human Rights Violations and Hate Crimes

Moved and seconded. The resolution was read in its entirety as edits were made after working Board meeting and before this Board meeting. Public comment was had by multiple individuals on the resolution. After the conclusion of public comment the process for how the resolution was written was shared. It was shared that this resolution was written in the same manner as the resolution that was passed on Anti-Semitism. It was shared that the authors of this resolution attended both listening sessions held at Sac State. A roll call vote was then called. Adopted.

2023/24-11-76/ Barayia – Green Schoolyards Grants for Nonprofit Child Care Facilities Form for ASI Children's Center Application

Moved and seconded. Funding is needed to redo the play yards of the Children's Center. The construction project is estimated to costs over \$2 million. The grant requires a resolution in support of the application from the Board. Adopted.
